    - Arrive Brussels 09.20 am – meet with tour guide at arrival hall






### Mons area

### In Flanders Fields Museum

"The museum tells the tale of the war through the eyes of those people who lived through it: soldiers, civilians, medical personnel... The personal stories always impress the visitor, but also provide an excellent introduction to the battlefields of the Ypres Salient." Following the museum, visit a number of historic WWI sites, all within a few minutes drive of Ypres...

### Caterpillar Mine Crater




The Caterpillar Mine Crater is the bestpreserved crater from the Mine Battle of Messines Ridge



### Lunch and free time in Ypres


### Day 2 Afternoon

- After lunch, drive along Hell Fire Corner and the Menin Road where you can see the remains of German bunkers, British trenches and mine craters.
  - Opposite Hooge Crater Cemetery is Hooge Crater Museum, the best private museum on WWI.





Via Polygon Wood onwards to Tyne Cot Cemetery, the largest Commonwealth cemetery of the Great War. From Tyne Cot, drive to Passchendaele and the Canadian Crest Farm Memorial. The ruins of Passchendaele were the scene of bitter fighting in October and November 1917. The final stage of the 3rd Battle of Ypres resulted in high casualty numbers.














### **Costs Involved**



Total Cost: <u>€399</u> per student:

- 1 Night B&B
- Return Flights to Belgium
- Transfer to and from Dublin Airport
- Tours, transport & insurance abroad
- Lunch & Dinner during the day

### Risk Assessment: Belgium

All entrants to Belgium require a passenger locator form
Ireland is classified as an EU 'red region' by Belgium
Passengers from the age of 12 arriving from an EU red region, and holding an EU Digital Covid Certificate (EU-DCC), are exempted from testing and quarantine requirements [PCR Negative Test or Full Vaccine Status]

### **Risk Assessment**



 <u>COVID</u>: Maintain the school's COVID policy throughout the trip. To mitigate any risk of infection, the pod of 24 (provisional) will be subject to social distancing (as feasible), mask wearing, & frequent hand sanitizing.

### **Risk Assessment**



- First Aid: Identical to our first aid kits that are provided in the school, we will bring our own equipment for the duration of the tip. Our staff are first aid trained.
  - <u>Medical Needs</u>: The needs of students (dietary, medical, allergy, etc.) will be identified once interest has been expressed. Any further concerns by guardians can be forwarded to organising team at any time.

Contact will be made via email to provide ample information regarding payment, documents required and timelines.

### Payment

The tour company has an online portal which will handle all finances for the trip. The school will not handle any money throughout the deposit process.

### Frequently Asked Questions

Is there anyone else considering such a trip?

Several other schools in this area are organising similar overseas trips.

Do the students need to be vaccinated?

Our Board of Management have decided that students must provide proof of:

- Vaccination

 Recovery from Covid within last 6 months
 Negative PCR test taken on Sunday 22nd May (this will cover any student for duration of the trip and removes need for a second PCR test in Belgium).

### Frequently Asked Questions

#### What is the situation in Belgium like now?

Belgium currently has Ireland on the red list. This is subject to change but as it stands makes no difference to EU residents with COVID certificates.

#### What happens if Belgium is still restricted?

If the tour is deemed not viable, the tour company will provide a full refund minus a €100 fee to cover cancellation costs. This is due to insurance policies.

#### A student has caught COVID and cannot travel?

Full cancellation will be covered by the insurance company within 14 days of departure.

### Frequently Asked Questions

A guardian decides the risk is too great and pulls their child from the trip despite easing of restrictions?

If the trip is viable, under the insurance policy, their refund will depend on notice but student will lose their initial deposit.

Will students need spending money?

As students will have free time at certain points during their schedule, this is up to guardians. Staff will not be holding onto money for students.

#### Will students be allowed their phones?

Students will be allowed their phones but strict guidelines will be in place during sensitive visits as to when they may use them.
